Laura made some notes on the Town Plan Objectives and Policies. We should be thinking about the things that have changed. She noted that we do not have aquifer recharge areas mapped. We also do not have shallow soils mapped but when septic systems are designed there are soil tests done so maybe it is not a high priority to map these soils. Unique geological areas are not mapped. Ryan mentioned some old mining areas in town some are mentioned on p 23 of the Town Plan.
