3	Selection of Commission Chair and Secretary	Weezie resigned as chair of the SCC. She will now serve as Secretary. Michelle will now serve as Chairperson
4	Walks and Talks	 Autumn Treasures was interesting and fun for all participants, however turnout was small. Many conflicting events the same day. Consider less W & T's in the future to see if saturation is an issue. Michelle has agreed to set up projector for both mid_winter Library events. Connie will make bat and bears cookies. The Invisible Mammal on ⊕/2/20/26 at 7:00pm and Living in Harmony with Bears on 3/13/26 at the same time Tracking in Snow - Linda will send reminder for their December Times and pull emails from last walk at Jakobsen's land for event when tracking weather is good.
5	Wildlife Road Crossing Project	 Linda shared the maps generated by Jens showing our data as compared to current overlay map and Vt Conservation Design priority areas. She emphasized the need to consider very precise language in the next Town Plan in regards to effectiveness of overlays to protect wildlife corridors, important not justnecessarily for Shrewsbury but for whole northeastern states to Canada. Melissa discussed how forest blocks are critical. It was decided to invite Laura and Melissa from SPC to attend a zoom call with Jens to discuss adjustments to overlay maps based on the new data. Linda will set up the meeting. Linda is taking a course on tracking offered by Sofie, from Master Naturalist Program. She will send info on it to others.
